parking garage at Alewife Station (Routes 2 and 16 at the mbridge/Belmont/Arlington line) allows access to the Red Line bway. aving the airport, follow the signs to the Sumner Tunnel. Entering tunnel, keep in the right lane. At the end of the tunnel, keepin the right lane, follow sign for Storrow Drive. Take Exit 26 Cambridge/Somerville, Follow the Back Bay/Cambridge signs not take the exit for Cambridge/Somerville). Keep in the right ne and follow the Storrow Drive West signs. After passing under pedestrian walkbridges, change to the left lane and take Exit N. Turn right and cross the Harvard Bridge. MIT's main entrance.
